It is important for undergraduate students of economics and political science, as well as any student interested in attending law school, to be familiar with the Economics of Law and Public Policy. The purpose of this unique two-course summer program is to help students understand the relationships between law and legal institutions, and their effect on the economy. We start by analyzing government expenditures, such as Social Security, Medicare, and food stamps. We also analyze the economic effects of the taxes that are used to finance those public expenditures. We also study legal relationships between private parties (such as property law. contracts, and torts) and the legal relationship between the individual and the state (such as government takings of private property, and criminal law).
